# Mayor's Message

## Dear Friends, Neighbors and Citizens,

It is October! Where has the time gone? Christmas is around just the corner and that means Light-up! October is a very busy month. We have National Night Out, the Costume Fun Run, a Fall City Wide Garage Sale (I believe our first) and Halloween. Football season is well under way, so please try to go to a Roosevelt High School football game; it is a lot of fun! In the November Newsletter, I plan a recap of the budget for your information. It will be lengthy, but it is an important read. As I am writing this article, the proposed fiscal year 2012/2013 budget (October-September) has been placed on the city's web site and the entire, final budget for Fiscal Year 2012/2013 will be on the city's website once it is passed by the City Council. We encourage you to remain active and involved, and we promise that we will continue to modify, change and refine how we do business. **As we all know: If we stay the same, we cannot improve.**

**Budget:** Staff and the Council have been working on the budget for quite some time. There have been many discussions (some spirited) and plans presented and proposed. As I have indicated, it is our goal to invest over \$3 million dollars on the streets and over \$1 million in the parks/common areas/entrances all in cash over the next 3 years. At the same time, we want to be debt free as a city within the next three years. We will continue to reduce taxes every year, while keeping a healthy reserve in the rainy day fund. This budget we will **REDUCE PROPERTY TAXES by 2%, and ADD police officers** while also improving the health benefits for the city's staff. We plan to continue to reduce taxes every year all-the-while continuing making significant investments in our great city and increasing the rainy day fund over the next two – three years from over 4.4 months to 5 months. A more comprehensive summary of the budget and plans will be in November's Newsletter. These goals will be accomplished if we all continue to work as a team.

**Finance:** Our sales tax increased over 12 percent for the month of August. This translates to approximately \$30,000 more revenue for the month as compared to last year. Additionally, the Windcrest Economic Development Corporation (WEDC) paid an additional \$187,000 towards the Texas Leverage Fund Loan (TLF loan) for Racker Road. This additional payment will save approximately \$96,000 in interest. This Council has transferred over \$250,000 to the EDC to help pay off the TLF loan. It should also be noted that the WEDC has over \$200,000 budgeted for projects in FY 2012/2013 and over \$38,000 for the promotion of Windcrest. This is more than has ever been earmarked for projects and promotion in our history.

**National Night-Out:** Your Council and Administration has given this National event a higher priority, especially our Police Department and Chief Al Ballew. We encourage everyone to participate. It is Tuesday, October 2 from 6 – 9 PM. From 6 – 8:30 PM at City Hall, we will have a City-wide gathering in conjunction with the individual street and area gatherings. The city will provide free entertainment, food and beverages to all. This is a great opportunity to meet your neighbors and game plan, strategize and exchange Light-up decorating ideas. Please read Police Chief Ballew's article later in this Newsletter for more details.

**Administration/Permits and Courts:** Rackspace has delivered plans and asked for permits to begin Phase

6 of their build out of the old Windsor Park Mall, which is their International Headquarters. They have over one million square feet of office space and are continuing to expand. After the first of the year, they plan on even more expansion. This means not only that they are successful and happy to be here in Windcrest, but Windcrest receives tens of thousands of dollars in revenue with the permits and inspection fees. Additionally, the administration staff is currently checking all business registrations in the city to make sure all businesses are in compliance and registered correctly so that the city receives the tax dollars we deserve. They also wanted me to relay that they continue to strive to make customer service better and to become more efficient. With Courts, we recently completed our 5th Warrant Round Up. It was a huge success. We were successful in clearing 61 warrants! The Court staff and Police Department did an incredible job. You might recall that this administration was the first to conduct Warrant Round Ups. We plan on doing 4 per year. Additionally, Warrant Officer Fackelman is on pace to generate over \$170,000 in warrant revenue this year alone. Our court operations are becoming the model for our sister cities.

**City Hall Campus, Parks, Pool and Common Areas:** Are you enjoying the new shades the city purchased at Takas Park for the playground equipment? Please go by and see these new additions that increase the quality of life for our residents and their families. There are many more improvements planned for the future. The proposed Master Plan for the Parks can currently be viewed on the city's website. Please note: this is a work in progress. I have received overwhelming support of my proposal to build soccer field(s) and add additional park space at the Jim Seal Drive and Crestway area which we are leveling off so that it may be more usable. Additionally, many of our residents have asked that we make a Pickle Ball court at Takas Park. That request will be fulfilled in the very near future. A special thanks to the Windcrest Little League who showed up "in force" at the Takas Park Baseball Fields on September 9th and volunteered the entire day cleaning up the fields and the buildings. I have said it a lot, but still not enough – THANK YOU. Please remember that this administration will listen to all comments so - **please let me hear from you. I need to know what you think.** You have a needed voice in these continued improvements.

**Friends of the Park (FOTP):** A special thank you goes out to this organization for organizing a group of student volunteers from Roosevelt High School to inventory all the trees in our parks and green spaces. This is a valuable resource that the city will use in planning, maintaining

and improving the quality of our parks and common areas. These students also volunteered and inventoried the trees for the Windcrest Golf Course. A very special thanks to all the FOTP chaperones and especially to Mr. Hanes and Mr. Fisher for executing this project. I enjoyed handing out certificates to all the students who participated. What a great bunch of young men and women!

**Light-Up:** Can you believe we are just months away from the biggest event of the year! Please, start your planning now. Judging will be December 12 and Light-up starts December 15th. A lot more is being planned for this year. We hope to have the biggest Light-up in our history! After all, we are the City of Lights. The Windcrest Firefighters and the Windcrest Little League are willing to help residents put up their lights and decorations. 
I wanted to point out some of the exciting events for this month with the Windcrest Animal Control Task Force (W<sup>Act</sup>).

Dear Fellow Citizens,  
 In my September newsletter article, I stated that "I never got involved in city stuff until past city leadership and city personnel ripped us off for millions of dollars." This lost money was from a \$5M check Rackspace gave Windcrest to build a road for them. A couple of citizens took offense when I put "past city leadership" in the same sentence with the alleged perpetrators of the fraud (the city manager at the time and his brother). However, I did so in good faith and from my heart... and I stand by it.

Why? When I was in the military and in a command (leadership) position, I could indeed delegate authority to subordinates. However, I was still responsible and accountable for whatever I delegated. In essence, if something went awry, it was still my fault...period. When the city council and EDC delegated authority to the mayor and the city manager carte blanche approval under Resolution #275 on 1-22-07 to act in their behalf "on all matters" regarding the road project, they were still responsible and accountable... period.

Trust me, I don't want to dwell on the past as Windcrest has done a heck of a job to rectify the issues and it's time to put it behind us and move forward... period. The road is on its way to completion, some of the lost funds have been recovered, the road project is fully funded, and Windcrest is in very good financial shape. Time to move on!

During the month of August the Mayor and Council were busy with Council Meetings, Budget Workshops and Public Hearings. Resolutions that were passed were **2012-387 (R)**, a resolution approving contracts with Diverse Media Inc. for producing two smart phone apps and maintenance of two smart phone apps for one year and authorizing the City Manager to negotiate and execute contracts for such purposes, **2012-388 (R)**, a resolution approving the purchase of a police Tahoe vehicle with installed police equipment to be purchased with funds from the WCCPD, **2012-389 (R)**, a resolution approving payment of the annual software maintenance fee renewal for police communications, police reporting and record keeping software from funds of the WCCPD, **2012-390 (R)**, a resolution approving the purchase of police vehicle laptops to be purchased with funds from the WCCPD, **2012-391 (R)** a resolution approving an interlocal cooperation contract between the City and the Texas Department of Public Safety (TDPS) regarding the issuance of drivers licenses for persons who fail to appear in response to traffic citations and authorizing the City Manager to execute said contract, **2012-392 (R)** a resolution authorizing renewal of the Acadian Ambulance service agreement upon the same terms and conditions provided in the original agreement and authorizing the City Manager to execute a renewal of the agreement.



For those of you that take full advantage of our great parks here in Windcrest, you may have noticed a few changes there. We have installed new basketball goals on the court located in Takas Park. Fall is upon us and the trees and alleys need to be inspected for compliance. Notices were sent out to all residents and businesses over 60 days ago to trim their trees/bushes in the alley according to the ordinance. Inspections of the alleys will begin 01 October 2012. The notice explains the process and citations will be issued for non-compliance as mentioned in the notice.

Did you know certain projects or repairs around your home/business may require a permit? Prevent a work stoppage or citation, please check with city hall before starting any projects/repairs and inquire if a permit is needed. In the past persons have been cited and projects/repairs have been stopped for failure to obtain a permit. After hour's emergencies, requires you to obtain a permit on the next business day. No project/repair can be continued or started without following the required procedures. Save money and time, check before starting. Ask work crews about the permits before starting projects/repairs; their San Antonio permits are not good here.

A list of residents who are not in compliance with the following city ordinance has been obtained. Subchapter 12.1300, Amended with Ordinance #483 / Refusal to Pay for Solid Waste and Refuse Collection and Disposal Service Charges Declared Lawful. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation, whether residential or business, to refuse to pay charges for solid waste and refusal collection authorized in Ordinance #336, as amended. The refusal or failure to pay such charges constitutes a health, safety and welfare hazard and therefore shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$1.00 nor more than \$2000.00 for each day that such offense continues, each day being a separate offense. Such offense shall commence on the day after the due date for payment of the solid waste and refuse charges, and shall continue daily thereafter until paid. If you have been notified and not paid, a citation will be issued upon contact; your costs could increase with a fine. Failure to appear will require a warrant for your arrest and that will cost you even more money, plus your valuable time. So please pay your bill.

If you need any assistance or want to report a violation of the Windcrest City Code, please contact your Code Enforcement Officer via the Windcrest Police Department Dispatcher at 210-655-2666.

**COMPLIANCE WITH WATERING RESTRICTIONS.** The Windcrest City Council recently delegated the responsibility for enforcing compliance with watering restrictions to the District. Stay tuned for further details as this task is undertaken by the District. It will take us a couple of months to get this sorted out. In the meantime, we encourage you to comply with the once a week regimen you are familiar with.

**WATER STATISTICS FOR THE MONTH:** The average household used approximately 12,900 gallons of water (17.2 ccf) during the July-August billing cycle. That's about 177 gallons per person per day; it was 150 gallons last month and it compares favorably to the 213 gallons per person last year during the same time frame. Consumption during this billing period ranged from zero to 78 ccf (58,350 gallons).

During the July-August billing period, we pumped a total of 37.8 million gallons. Last year this time under very similar conditions, we pumped 46.8 million gallons. Good For You!

**RAINFALL:** We received 0.80 inches of rainfall in August for a total of 24.94 inches for 2012. We are still above average for the year. Go to <http://www.srh.noaa.gov/product-view.php?pil=DGTEWX> for a comprehensive drought status report.

## Cruelty to Animals



Are you aware of Texas Law regarding Cruelty to Animals? The City of Windcrest Police Department has zero tolerance for offenses against our animals. A summary of Cruelty to Animals (Misdemeanor) offenses includes but is not limited to, failing to provide food, care or shelter to an animal in the person's custody; abandons an animal; confines an animal in a cruel manner and/or injures an animal. If you are found guilty of these misdemeanor crimes against animals...you can spend 1 year in jail and receive a \$4,000.00 fine. A summary of Cruelty to Animals (Felony) offenses includes but is not limited to, torturing an animal; kills, seriously injures, or administers poison to an animal or causes one animal to fight with another. If you are found guilty of these felony crimes against animals...you can spend 2 years in jail and receive a \$10,000.00 fine. If you use a deadly weapon in the commission of the offense or have been previously convicted of any felony offense, you can be prosecuted for a 3rd Degree Felony.

Are you having problems with a feral cat? Are you thinking about leaving something out that will cause poisoning or serious injury to the animal? Do you want to take a chance on spending up to 2 years of your life in prison... behind bars? We will investigate... we will arrest! There are other options... call us and we will help you with your animal problems!

Cruelty to Animals is a serious offense and we treat it very seriously in Windcrest. If you are having a problem with an animal, domestic or wild, contact the City of Windcrest Animal Control through the Windcrest Police at 655-2666. An Animal Control officer will be dispatched and will provide a solution to your problem. Think before you act... don't suffer through an arrest, prosecution and possible conviction of a crime that could have been easily avoided!


