Meetings with the Mayor: If anyone ever wishes to meet and/or discuss any issues they have regarding the city, feel free to call me or text on my cell at **210-846-5507**. I answer most calls or they are returned timely if you leave a message. I also return all text messages. Please never hesitate to call during the day, night or weekends. I am always working. I mention this as several citizens have asked me regarding having a coffee with the mayor or other regular day once a month to have meetings. I pride myself on being available to meet around the people I serve schedules. Additionally, I am at City Hall virtually every day in the mornings, and this includes weekends. I look forward to meeting anyone who has an issue they would like to discuss. I enjoy these talks and meetings, even the ones where there is a complaint. If I do not hear about an issue, I cannot try to correct it. So again, if you need to meet or speak with me, please call or text me on my cell. I pride myself on being "on call" for all the citizens. That is why I serve.

Warrant Round-Ups: These were started under this administration. When we first started these Round-Ups, we advertised to our citizens what we were doing and when we were having them. Goal: We are trying to make sure that those that do not follow our laws and are ticketed - pay the price. We have generated well over \$100,000 every year doing these Round-Ups. Some have asked if we still conduct these Round-Ups. Yes, we conduct at least four every year. Additionally, we have been very active with our Warrant and Court Department in bringing those with warrants to justice. We even added a tip line. Rest assured, we will continue this practice under this administration.

***Parks and Recreation Committee:** This committee, lead by Jan Leaders, is working hard for your quality of life and spending countless hours vetting and working to invest in the community and improve our quality of life. We are working on options for a Senior Citizens Center, and should have more to report soon. This is a top priority. The following four paragraphs are brief summaries of what the Parks and Rec has been accomplishing with the support of Council and city staff. All the investments are being done with cash and no debt, and work will be starting very soon – so please pardon the dust.

1. Tennis Courts: The courts at Takas Park will be receiving a long overdue investment. The courts will be resurfaced and a Pickle Ball Court added for us all to enjoy. This amenity is a valuable asset to our community and Takas Park.

2. Soccer Field: The Council has voted to move forward with investing in a soccer field for our community. It will be our first! Over the next three months, you will see work being done on a soccer field on the corner of Jim Seal Drive and Crestway. I am excited about the location. I bet former Mayor Jim Seal is smiling from above. For those of us that knew him, he did so much for the quality of life, and for the families of Windcrest when he served. We are back on track and investing in these much needed amenities for our families. I think of him a lot, as he made growing up in Windcrest special.

3. Winnbrook Estates Park: The Council voted to commence with Phase 3 of this much needed park for this area. We have allocated \$50,000 to be invested in this Park. The Parks and Rec will be working with the WBE HOA on this project.

4. Windcrest Little League Complex: The Council has approved to replace all the fencing for the Little League Fields and to add new scoreboards. A special thank you to the Public Works crew and all the volunteers that are assisting in fixing up the fields. Additionally, there are more improvements planned over the last several months. It is this administration's goal to have a first class Little League Complex. We are working toward that goal. We could not do it without the volunteers. Thank you to all of them, and please support the Windcrest Little League!

Streets and Alleys: As of the time I am writing this article, the Council has approved Phase 4 of the Street CIP Project. The city will be investing approximately \$800,000 into the streets and alleys over the next 7 months. This is an all cash investment. I am confident even more will be allocated during this Fiscal Year.

DATE CHANGE = Spring Garage Sale Weekend: This year it is **May 4 – 7**. Please sign up at City Hall if you are going to have a Garage Sale and take advantage of the free permit for this event. We ask that all those participating sign up so that we can add those participants to a map that we pass out to those desiring one.

DATE CHANGE = Spring Brush Pick-Up: This service will commence on **May 22 – June 9**. More information will be in the next Newsletter.

Public Schools: This administration is committed to assisting where we can to help improve our public schools in the area. Council Person James McFall has taken the lead in these efforts. We should all commend Mr. McFall for the passion and energy he is bringing to this effort. Mr. McFall has coordinated presentations before the Council from Windcrest Elementary, Ed White Middle School and Roosevelt HS. I am a proud alum from all three!! The presentations were impressive and informative. They are archived on the website. I encourage everyone to take the time and watch these presentations. They will inform and inspire. The children are our future, and Windcrest Elementary is in the center of our city. The better these schools do, the better we will do. Additionally, Mr. McFall and his son James Carlos McFall formed the Northeast Bridge Builders. It is a 501c(3) charity dedicated to helping the cluster of schools that feed Roosevelt, along with Roosevelt itself. They meet regularly. Quite a few citizens have joined, but they need more. Please reach out to Mr. McFall at jmcfall33@gmail.com if you are interested in learning more. **If you are interested in participating with their fundraiser Golf Tournament it is going to be held on Friday, April 7th, at the Windcrest Golf Course. FORWARD MARCH... ..With March we begin Daylight Savings Time on the 12th, then we have the first day of spring on March 20th. The Little League also begins another season this month.



During our February City Council meeting we approved the purchase of three new scoreboards for our ball fields at Takas Park. The old scoreboards were VERY OLD, and past feasible repair. All 3 new scoreboards are being purchased and installed for \$17,800. This is a great addition for our ball fields.

An Alley Maintenance Plan for repairs and a Street Base Failure repair program were presented to the council by Leonard Young, City Engineer. An update and recommendation from our Street Capital Improvement Program package #4 was also presented. Walter Raleigh, Parkcrest, and Sunhaven were selected. All three of these projects were approved to go out for bid.

The council approved a plan for allocating two \$2,000 Scholarships from the Roosevelt Scholarship Fund. This fund has been maintained by the city and is for current Roosevelt High School Students. Representatives of our local civic groups will select the winners.

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

MOVING FORWARD IN THE CITY OF WINDCREST

Our city is back on track going forward to repair and replace items in and around the city that have been neglected for a while. Our city is working on a plan to continue to keep the alleys clean and safe for the trash trucks to go through and pick up trash. There are approx. 10 miles of Alleys and it will cost approx. \$150,000.00 a year to keep our alleys passable. Every alley was field inspected and ALL alleys will need repair.

Next our city is going forward on street repairs. Every street in the city was field inspected by our city Engineer, Leonard Young. There are in excess of 50 streets and 100 locations with immediate base failure repair needs. The estimated cost of these repairs is Approx. \$152,000.00. Some of the risks, if no repairs are made, could be major street failures, more cost to the city if a contractor has to come in on short notice. As time goes by it will cost more. Also If no repairs are made it will affect all motorist driving on our streets. If all goes well and bid packages are out by the end of February or beginning of March, a contractor could be ready to start by mid April and by mid end of June the work could be completed.

Our Animal Control vehicle, the van, is still on track. The City is checking around for the best cost and safety package for the van. Our Police Chief and our City Manager will provide an up date by our 1st meeting in March.

I want to thank Mr. Frank Martin for his hard work in going forward to present to the Mayor and Council needed repairs and additions on making our Little League baseball fields better and more enjoyable fields. Some, but not all, items discussed were fencing and score boards.

Spring is upon us and that means more people will be out and about on the roadways, biking, walking, running and enjoying the season! Please help prevent accidents and help us protect all pedestrians. Don't forget...it's illegal to enter designated golf cart or pedestrian/bicyclist lanes. The operator of the motor vehicle attempting to turn must yield right of way to the golf cart or pedestrian/bicyclist that are traveling in their designated lanes of travel.

It's very important to remember that an operator of a motor vehicle must yield right of way to all pedestrians. An example of this is


a motor vehicle approaching a yield sign and a pedestrian approaching from the cross street. The operator of the motor vehicle must yield to the pedestrian and allow them to cross the street. Failing to yield right of way to pedestrians can result in a citation and even worse... serious injury or death.

Serious liability issues exist for inattentive drivers. If a driver's inattention, such as texting while driving, results in an accident that causes serious bodily injury or death ... that driver may be charged with a felony crime resulting with imprisonment up to 20 years. Did you know that in 58% of all crashes, the driver was inattentive or engaged in some other non-driving-related activity... that means that 58% of all crashes could be PREVENTED! Distracted driving is never an excuse for negligence or recklessness.

Attention all pet owners!

When you are walking your pets, dogs or cats, they must be on leashes. This applies to anywhere in the city outside of your own fenced property. This is in accordance with the Code of Ordinances, Section 6-62 and with

Ordinance #2016-751(O) setting fees for various ordinances.

If a pet is off leash, a citation will be issued and the owner will go before the City Judge. The Judge has the discretion to fine offenders up to \$2,000.00 for disobeying a City Ordinance. We do not have a dog park in Windcrest, so please leash your dogs and cats. There are many dog parks located in the surrounding cities if you must feel the need to exercise your dogs off leash. And yes, the Ordinance 6-62 specifies unaltered cats are not to be allowed to run or be off leash.

Another reminder for all those visiting our parks, especially the Brook Falls Pond area - bread is NOT a food for ducks. The ducks cannot digest the bread and it is also not good for the eco system of the pond. I had an earlier article about this subject so if you are just walking in the pond areas and observe others who are feeding the ducks anything but grain, please inform them of this problem. All of us want to keep our wildlife healthy and want a pleasant park in which to enjoy ourselves. Both of these items, if followed, will help us achieve that goal.

Spring cleaning time again! It's also that time of year when the grass, weeds and vegetation start growing. As a reminder: City Ordinance states, the first violation notice delivered to your door will advise you of what the violation is and how long you have to correct it. Any future violations for the same issue within the same calendar year can result in the issuance of a citation to appear in court. Please schedule your property maintenance accordingly and help to ensure that the city stays beautiful. Take advantage of the spring curb side brush pick-up, but please, DO NOT put items out too early. Please READ the mail notification carefully in order to determine when YOUR pick up times will be, prepare a plan. Don't forget to clean your backyard, trim your branches, cut vegetation, grass and weeds in the alley behind your property fence. It is also time to clean your swimming pools. Plan and execute a pool maintenance schedule. If possible, please try and contact your neighbor in the spirit of community betterment about their dirty pool and your concerns for mosquito breeding before calling. Please notify Code Compliance and Enforcement of any abandoned swimming pools in your area.


